My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus, Greetings in His Wonderful Name!

We celebrate the tenth anniversary of the worst terrorist attack in American history – and as we consider the wounds that still remain from this terrible day, it is not unusual for us to be filled with emotion. I can still recall the morning it happened – Father Riley running into our 8:45 Mass and asking us to please pray as we were being attacked.

The next day we saw the Pentagon and saw the smoke and the plane still inside the building. We and all who were there just cried and cried to know that so many loved ones had burned to death. Something happened deep inside me that I have never been able to escape or forget.

What I felt that day at the Pentagon is what many of us experience when confronted with the reality of the pain and devastation one person or group of people can cause others. Our very souls come to a choice: we can either choose to be victims, nursing our anger and becoming bitter, or we can be victorious, turning to God and allowing Him to teach us through our pain.

The truth is we all experience hurts and betrayals that pierce us profoundly. The 2001 terrorist attacks were a tragedy that affected us all on a national level, but there are injuries each of us endure that have just as great an impact on us permanently. Sometimes, as with 9/11, we can share those burdens with others. But other times we are left alone to deal with wounds that go deep.

We experience injustices at the hands of others who cause us overwhelming grief and suffering. The pain gnaws at us and we wonder, “why God? Why did you allow these things to happen? Is there any hope left?”

Are you experiencing this kind of grief today? Has your world come crashing down due to another’s hurtful action? Have you lost someone or something that is very precious to you? If so, I want to remind you that God is still on His throne....and He loves you unconditionally.

Did the Lord cause these terrible things to happen to you? NO. But if He permitted it in your life, you can be absolutely certain of one important thing – If you will respond in the right way, with forgiveness and faith, you will see the Father’s hand working through the trial in a positive manner – you could not experience otherwise (Romans 8:28).

Remember, as children of a sovereign God, we are never victims of our circumstances. We can be victorious despite the wrongs done to us. The problems we face can bring us into greater intimacy with the Father if we will seek and trust Him!

May God be PRAISED!! Do not forget, but forgive those who have offended us. With God, it is possible!
